



Morrisons

Morrisons is a major British supermarket retailer, with more than 120,000 colleagues in 491 stores serving over 11 million customers every week. Morrisons operates its own sites making meat, fruit and veg, fish, bakery and fresh food products – 17 in all – and is unique in preparing and making more than half of the fresh food sold in its stores, supported by over 9,000 trained butchers, bakers, fishmongers, cheesemongers and other skilled in–store specialists. Morrisons currently offers its customers a range of nearly 70 seafood species, with its range of wild caught seafood covering more than 50 species.

Summary

Morrisons aims to source its seafood from fisheries and farms that use methods which are the least detrimental to the environment. Morrisons is partnered with the Sustainable Fisheries Partnership (SFP) and became one of the first companies to participate in the Ocean Disclosure Project in 2015. The retailer is also a member of the Sustainable Seafood Coalition, a partnership of UK businesses working together to support sustainable seafood. This disclosure represents wild caught fish and seafood used in Morrisons products. While progress is being made on the capture of information for source fisheries used in aquaculture feed, these are not included.






